Beryl's parents were [Samuel Joe Cooper and Alice Mary Bird](#).

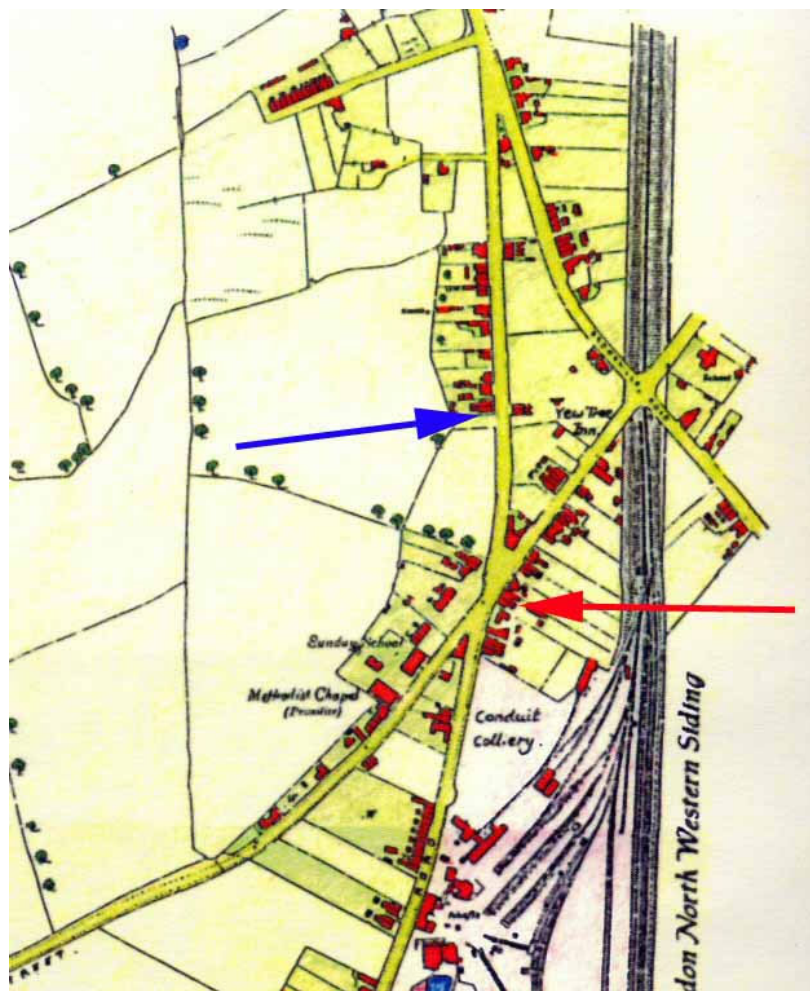
They were married on the 23rd December 1950

Alan and Beryl had one son -

- Andrew John Whorton - born on 14th April 1952 - married three times - to [Carole Betty Tinsley in 1979](#), [Susan Hitchings \(Cooke\) in 1994](#) and [Virginia Tacon in 1999](#)

Both Alan and Beryl both grew up in Norton Canes - in fact they lived just 200 yards apart with the Whorton Family living in the row of shops on the east side of Norton Square and the Cooper family living at 199 Hednesford Road - as shown by the red and blue arrows respectively on the following map



Beryl was the daughter of Sam and Mary Cooper - a mining family living in Norton Canes, Staffordshire – Sam actually spent 60 years working down the local coal mines and, himself, lived to the age of a hundred and three.

Alan was the son of William and Winifred Whorton who were storekeepers in Norton

The Cooper and Whorton families were very much local village families.

They Both went to school initially at Norton Canes but Beryl moved to a the Holy Rosary Convent School at Cannock and very early on decided she wanted to be a teacher

As a teenager Beryl learned to play the piano and sang in the school and local choir – she also took part in many sports – particularly hockey and tennis

Alan was also involved with music - singing in the church choir and becoming a baritone soloist. He was a keen cyclist and used to help his uncle Harry in the village bike shop on the square.

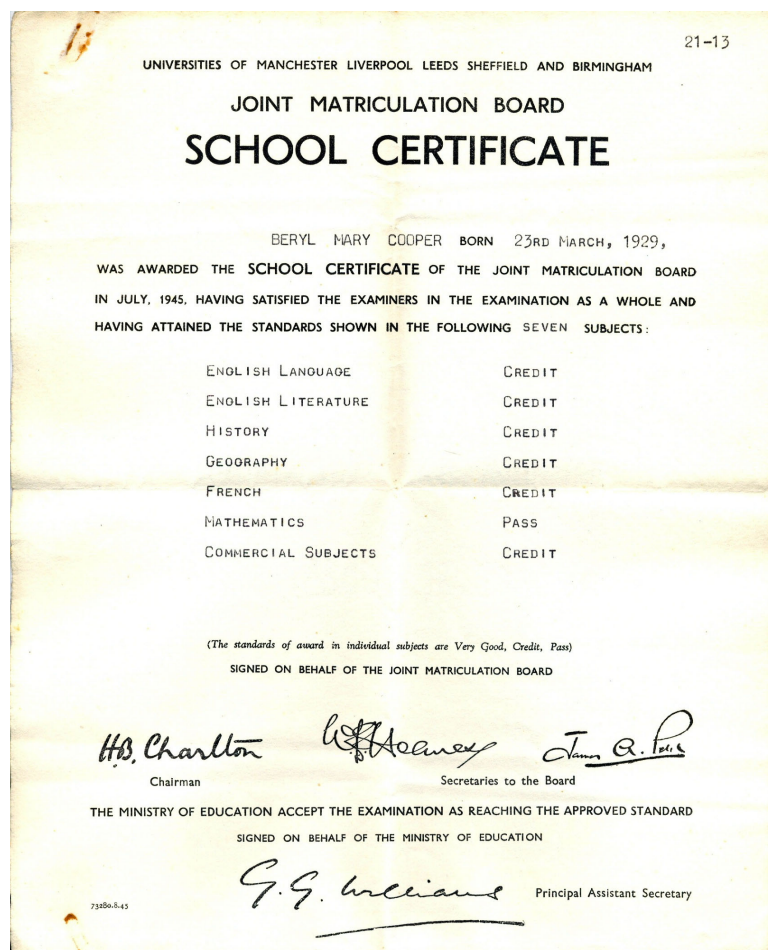

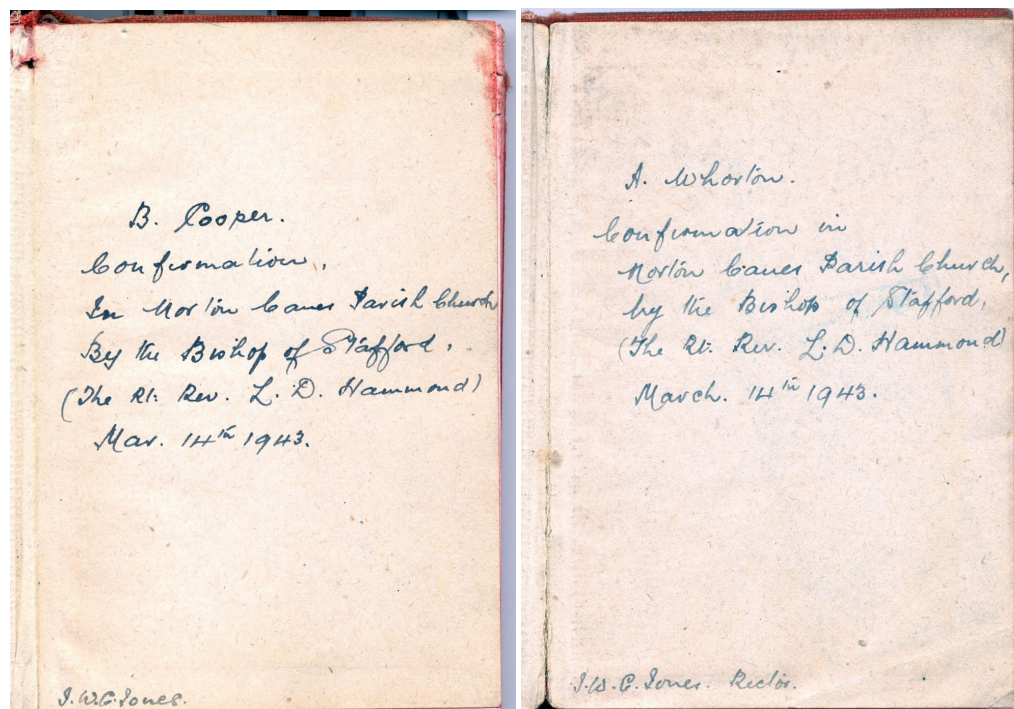

Alan and Beryl were both confirmed by the Bishop of Stafford at Norton Canes Parish Church on March 14th 1943



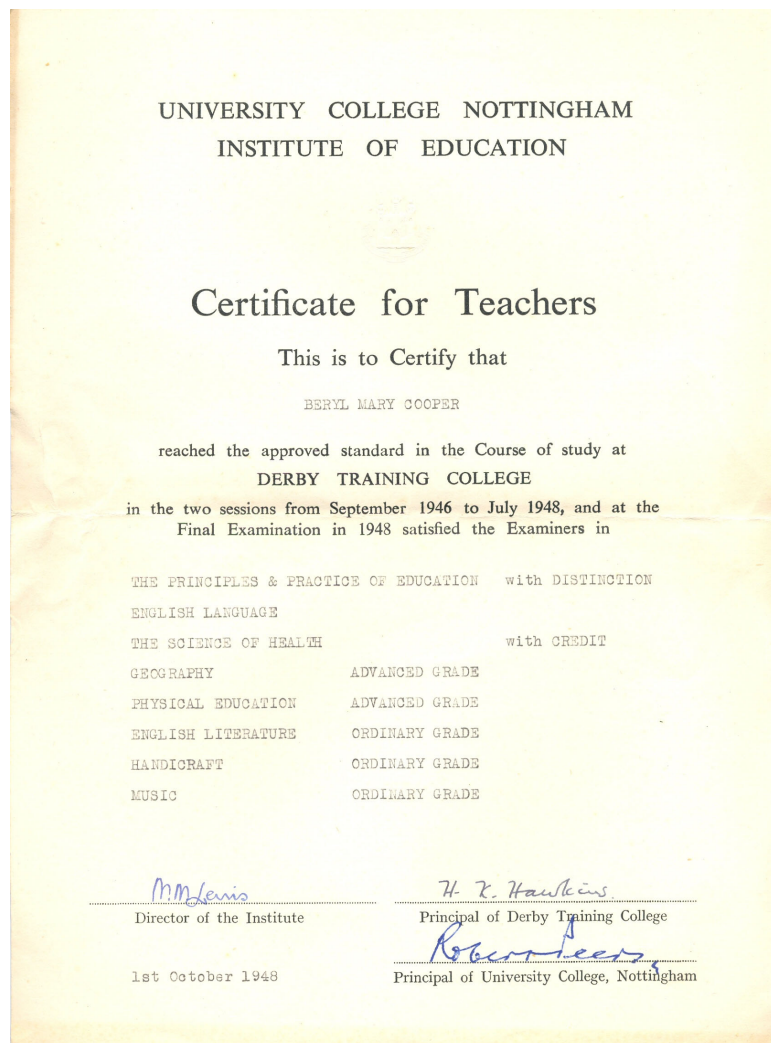
Alan was two years older than Beryl and lived just down the road – they had met before but came to know each other because he was in the church choir and the school choir merged with them for a Christmas concert in 1945. From then on they became inseparable

In 1946 Beryl went to Derby Teachers Training College where she continued to specialise in music and sport. Alan became an electrician at the local Jerome Colliery where the majority of the village were employed.

While Beryl was at college Alan and her would cycle 40 miles to meet each other at weekends and on one occasion missed each other on the way which ended up with her cycling all the way from Derby to Norton Canes and Alan all the way to Derby

During the two years that Beryl was at Derby Alan studied engineering at the Mining College in Cannock

Beryl became fully qualified as a teacher in July 1948

Your employment as a qualified teacher in any such school will be subject to the requirements stated in Schedule II 2(1) of the Regulations that "the first year of service of a teacher as a qualified teacher shall be a probationary year during which he shall satisfy the Minister of his practical proficiency as a teacher in a suitable school and under suitable supervision and conditions of work; provided that the Minister may, in exceptional cases, extend the probationary period beyond a year, or reduce it to less than a year, or waive the requirement of a probationary period". Service in Special Schools to which Regulation 30 of the Handicapped Pupils and School Health Service Regulations, 1945, applies is also subject to the probation requirements.

If you take your first post in a Direct Grant Grammar School or in any other school to which Regulation 15(2) does not apply you will not be subject to the probation requirements stated above so long as you are employed there nor will you be a Qualified Teacher under the Primary and Secondary Schools (Grant Conditions) Regulations, 1945; you will however be eligible for that status and be subject to the probation requirements mentioned in the preceding paragraph if you subsequently transfer to a school to which Regulation 15(2) applies.

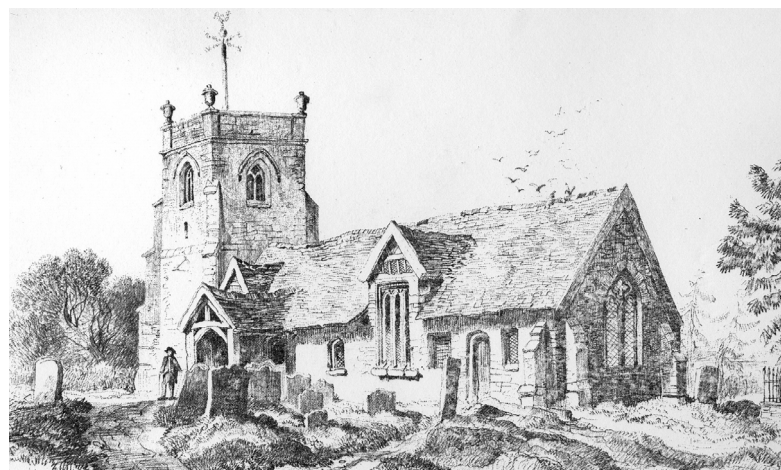

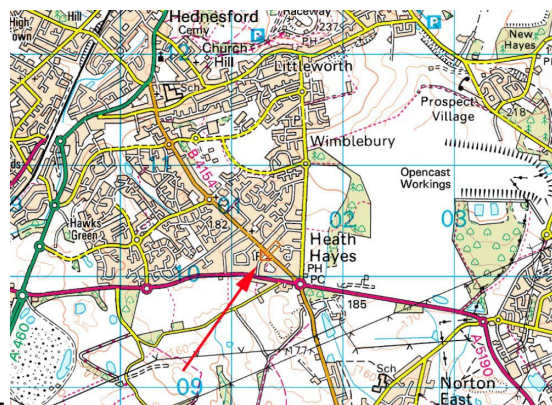

The two witnesses at the wedding were Alfred David Keay and Rita Price - the Best Man and Bridesmaid



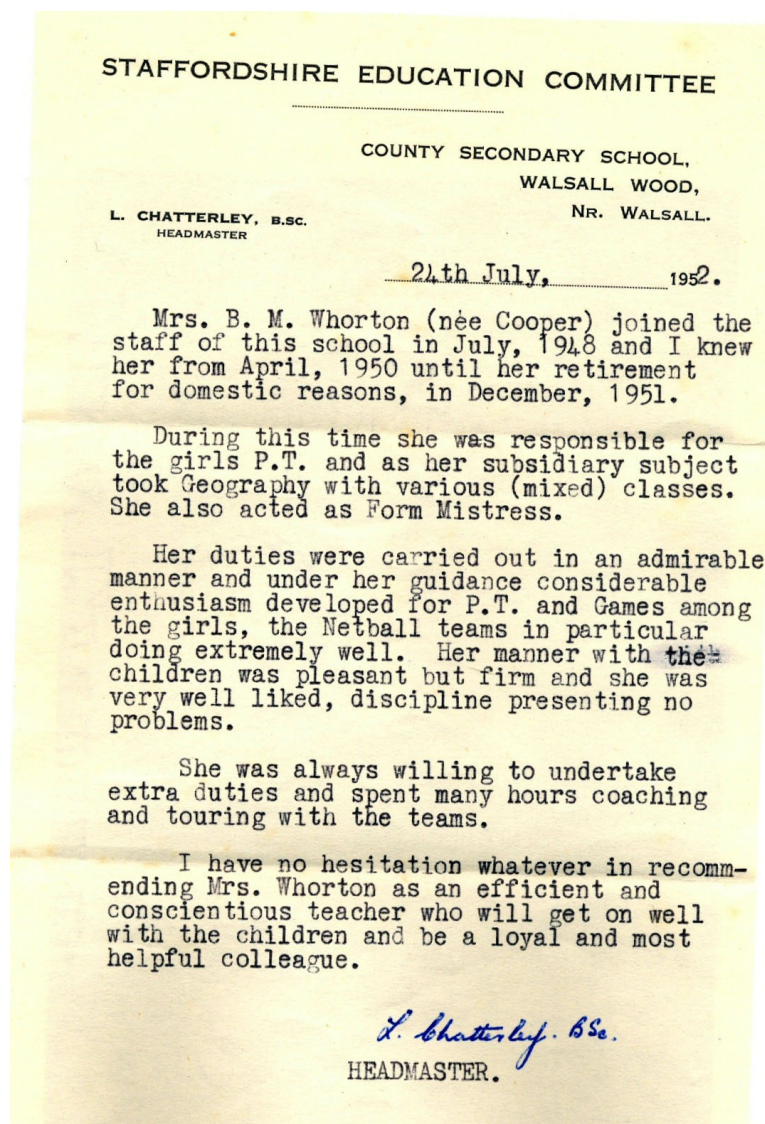
After they were married Alan and Beryl lived at 20 Chapel Street, [Heath Hayes](#) for a couple of years

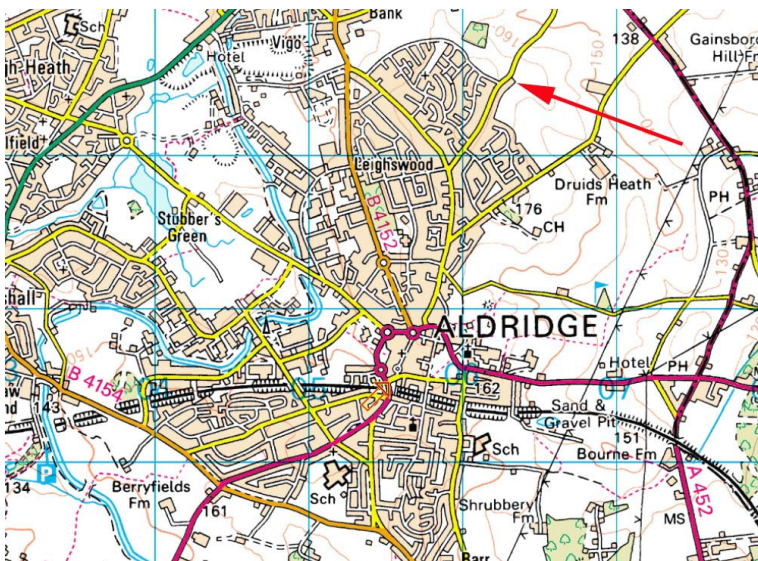

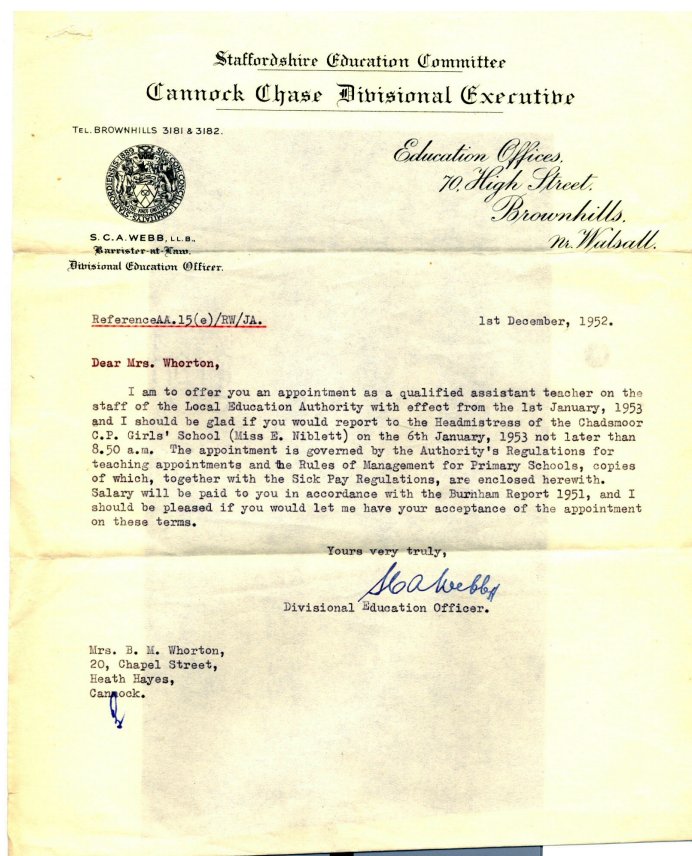


On 1st January 1953 Beryl Started work at Chadsmoor C P Girls School (actually starting on Jan 6th)

The family moved to 148 Lazy Hill Road, [Aldridge](#) in 1953



On 6th January 1953 Beryl Began Teaching at Chadsmoor C.P. Girls School



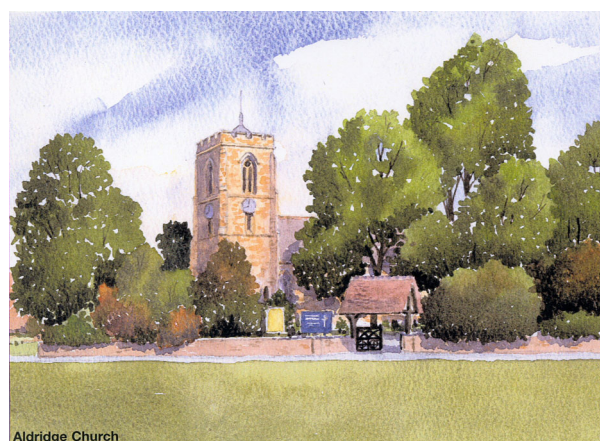
In 1955 they saw an advert in the local paper for someone who had this idea of forming an “Operatic Society” in Walsall.

They attended a meeting in Walsall and, from this, Walsall and District Operatic Society” was formed.

They were to take part part in shows for over 40 years and, in later years, they also joined Brownhills Choral Society and Brownhill Operatic Society.

Beryl became a teacher at the Aldridge, Cooper and Jordon, Church of England Endowed School and Andrew himself attended this school from 1956 to 1963

The school was just behind Aldridge Church



In 1958 a new school - Red House Primary School - was opened in Aldridge and Beryl went to teach there

They loved holidaying and had a number of caravans – and later in life motor caravans

In 1966 Andrew was confirmed at Lichfield Cathedral



In 1963 Andrew started at the Aldridge Grammar School



Alan and Beryl became well known for not only cooked meals but entertaining large groups of people with hot and cold buffets – particularly groups from the operatic Society.

Beryl would happily feed the 1000's ! and they would even turn up at outdoor events (in the motor caravan) and serve up cups of tea and cakes.

In 1969 they went abroad for the first time, driving to Kitzbuhel in Austria, and renting a villa for two weeks with friends of theirs.

This was a totally new experience for them and kicked off an interest in travelling further afield.

They were to go to Austria many times and also visit several other European countries.

In 1970 Andrew left school and started as a computer programmer at Tube Investments and, after a year there, went to the North Staffs Polytechnic to do a computing degree

In 1973 the family celebrated Andrews 21st Birthday with a party held in Stonnall Village Hall



In 1987 Beryl received a 25 year long service certificate from the Walsall Borough



In 1985 they were able to take part in celebrations for Beryl's father's One Hundredth Birthday with messages from the Queen and many other parties.



Beryl took early retirement when she was 57 having taught for nearly 40 years and Alan took retirement on health grounds

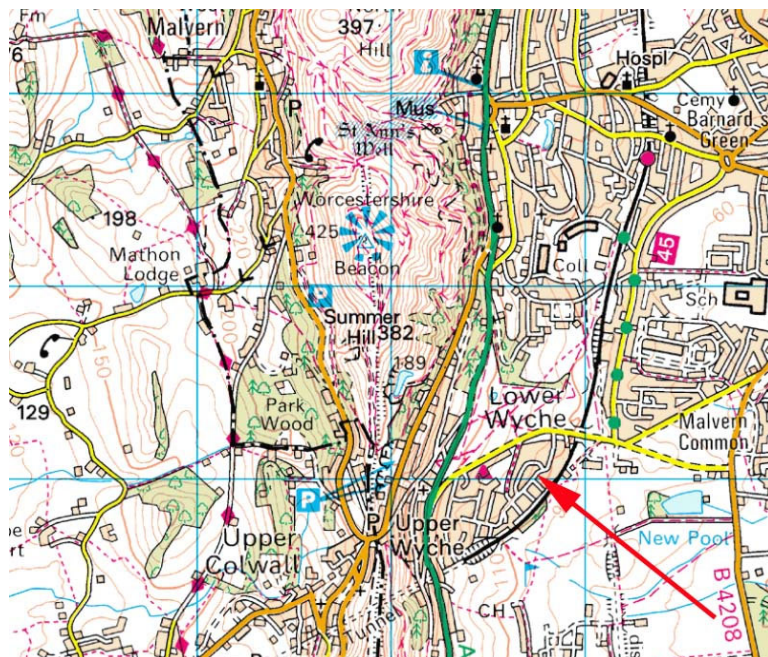

She had several health problems in later years and was also developing severe blindness



After being severely weakened by a bout of Coronavirus she passed away on July 31st 2022 at the age of 93
